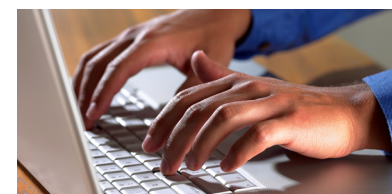


### Human Library Series: Get to Know the Transgender Community

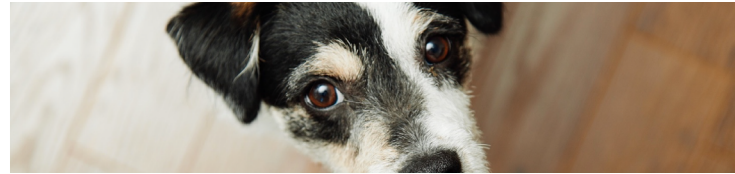

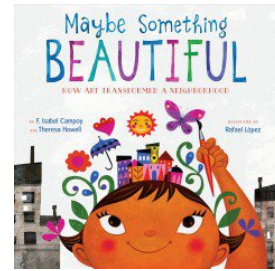
